

Whistler Olympic Park Spectator Transportation during the 2010 Olympic Winter Games



Whistler Olympic Park (WOP) is the host venue for cross-country skiing, Nordic combined, biathlon and ski jumping competitions during the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games. The Vancouver Organizing Committee for the 2010 Olympic and Paralympic Winter Games (VANOC) and its transportation partners are pleased to release comprehensive information on spectator transportation to Whistler Olympic Park during the Vancouver 2010 Olympic Winter Games.



From Whistler

Take local BC Transit to Whistler Village. BC Transit service is complimentary on the day of your Olympic event. To access Whistler Olympic Park, board the complimentary VANOC-provided WOP Express at Day Skier Lot 5 at the Whistler Transportation Mall. No parking is available for spectators at the Whistler Transportation Mall. Show your event ticket when boarding the bus. Reservations are not required. Arrive early to catch the WOP Express shuttle to avoid line-ups and ensure you arrive at your venue on time. Please refer to the chart on the right for your *estimated* departure time.

Pemberton-based spectators ride BC Transit #99 Pemberton Connector to Whistler Village then follow the instructions above.

From Squamish

VANOC will provide a complimentary Whistler Olympic Park shuttle (for Squamish residents and their guests only) departing from the Squamish Transit Exchange on Discovery Way (beside Wal-Mart in the Squamish Business Park) directly to Whistler Olympic Park. Please use BC Transit to the Squamish Transit Exchange. BC Transit is complimentary on the day of your Olympic event. No parking is available at the Squamish Transit Exchange.



A day-of-event ticket, boarding pass decal and government-issued photo identification are required to board the shuttle. The boarding pass decal is valid on the day of the Olympic event ticket only.

Boarding pass decals can be picked up at the Squamish Sea to Sky checkpoint permitting office (#2-40437 Tantalus Road) starting January 25. Proof of Squamish residency and your Olympic event ticket must be presented. For Squamish Sea to Sky checkpoint permit office hours, please visit travelsmart2010.ca.

The boarding pass decal will display your assigned departure time for the WOP shuttle leaving from the Squamish Transit Exchange.

From Vancouver

Spectators with tickets to Whistler Olympic Park events who are travelling from Metro Vancouver must be on the Olympic bus network, a charter bus service organized by VANOC and operating from a network of designated departure hubs in Metro Vancouver. Only Olympic event ticket holders may reserve seats on the Olympic bus network. There is no spectator parking at any Olympic venue.

After each competition, you will be transported back to your originating departure point. To reserve a seat on the bus, you must purchase an Olympic bus network transportation ticket. To book, visit departurehubs.clickandpark.com. Translink service is free on the day of the event for Olympic ticket holders.

Spectators are encouraged to plan their trip carefully as refunds will not be given if the return trip on the Olympic bus network is missed. Spectators travelling southbound from Whistler are welcome to make other arrangements for their return trip to Vancouver. Several commercial motorcoach companies currently provide service between Whistler and Vancouver; visit travelsmart2010.ca for more information.



Travel Tips

Please remember to allow lots of time to arrive at your venue. The total travel time will depend on weather and traffic conditions. When at the venue, you will be required to undergo a security screening and will then walk to the spectator plaza at your respective each stadium from the bus drop off location. Arrive early and enjoy the pre-show entertainment.
